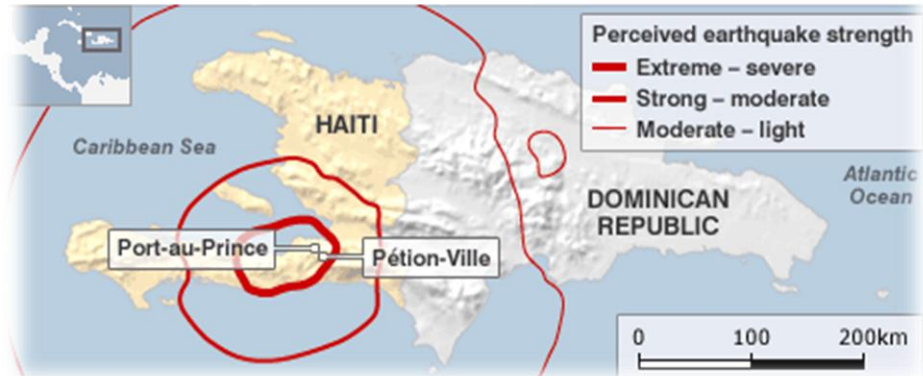

Helping Haiti and the Homeless

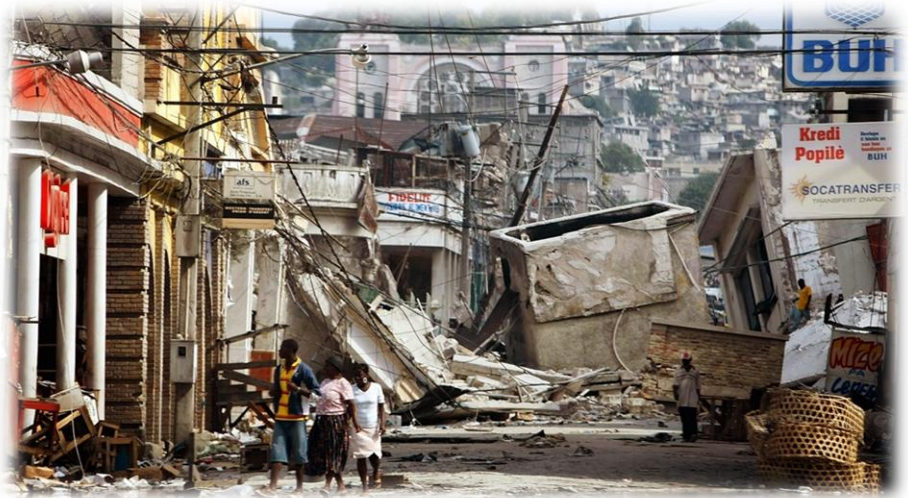

Areas affected by Haiti earthquake



On January 12, 2010, a 7.0 magnitude earthquake rocked Port-au-Prince, the capitol of Haiti, killing over 100,000 and leaving hundreds of thousands without food, water, and shelter.



From February 19 thru March 12, 2010, Key Club placed canisters in all 4th hours for donations for Haiti relief and for homeless veterans relief in the Detroit area. The winning class was Mr. Darwiche’s 4th hour which came out with an amazing \$172! We thank everyone for all the help and support they gave to this project because we made a total of \$541.49. \$275 has been given to the Mitch Albom project called Caring and Sharing Mission/Orphanage in Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Date: May 1st, 2010

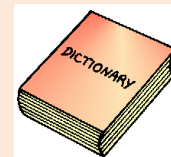
Time: 8:00 a.m. – 11:00 p.m.
